Sermon Discussion Questions

What is the hardest choice you've had to make in your life? How about this past week? How about today?

What choices does Moses set before Israel?

In the past how well did the Israelites succeed in following God and His commands? (See Deuteronomy 1:19-46; Exodus 14:10-12, 15:24, 16:3, 32)

The choice between life & good and death & evil seems obvious to us, but I often find myself making decisions that I know will have a bad result (hopefully less than I did when I was younger). Why do we made decisions that we know will have negative consequences?

In Romans 3:10-12 we read – *“None is righteous, no, not one; no one understands; no one seeks for God. All have turned aside; together they have become worthless; no one does good, not even one.”* How do you feel after reading this passage?

How does reading Romans 5:8 give us hope? *But God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.*
